

MOVING OUT OF MANITOBA

When you move from Manitoba to another jurisdiction there are certain things you will need to be informed of regarding your car insurance. Listed below is the information you will need...

- 1) You will have a certain number of days from your date of move to purchase a new insurance policy and driver's license in your new jurisdiction. Make sure that your insurance in Manitoba does not lapse within that time period.

You could be required to produce a claims history in your new jurisdiction. This document will state your claims history and could entitle you for a discount on your premiums depending on the policies in other jurisdictions. MPI will accept VISA or MASTERCARD for Claims Experience Letter requests taken over the phone at 985-7000 or 1-800-665-2410. - 2) You also might want to purchase a Drivers Abstract from Drivers Licensing. This document will state your driving record. Please contact MPI at 985-7000 or 1-800-665-2410.
- 3) Once you have purchased your new insurance in your new jurisdiction, you can send MPI a copy of your newly acquired registration to receive a refund - along with your Manitoba registration and your Manitoba plates (if you choose) so that MPI can cancel the Manitoba insurance. Please make sure you send MPI your new address so that if you have a refund remaining it will be returned to you, in your new jurisdiction.

LEAVING MANITOBA TEMPORARILY

If you are leaving Manitoba temporarily - to attend school, to work, or just to live in another location for an extended period of time - always check the rules that govern driver licensing and vehicle registration and insurance in your temporary location.

For Example: the definitions of "student" vary substantially from province to province and may affect whether or not you need to change your license and registration and hence, your vehicle insurance coverage.

It's your responsibility to ensure you comply with the rules in your new jurisdiction; to assist you, contact information for the other provinces is listed.

Your Autopac Coverage ends when:

- ✓ The place you've moved to requires you to register your vehicle there, or
- ✓ You register your vehicle in your new location, or
- ✓ Your Autopac coverage expires or you're suspended for failing to pay for coverage
- ✓ Any limits of your policy are exceeded

After you leave Manitoba, your Personal Injury Protection Plan coverage only applies if you're injured while driving or riding in your Manitoba-plated vehicle.

If you have to register your vehicle in your new jurisdiction, you must advise MPI directly to cancel your Autopac coverage. Keep the Transfer of Ownership Document portion of your Manitoba registration as proof you own the vehicle.

NEW RESIDENTS TO MANITOBA

You have a maximum of 90 days to get a driver's license, register and insure your vehicle after becoming a resident. If your out-of-province license and insurance expire prior to the 90 day limit, you must obtain Manitoba documents before that time. If your vehicle is a commercial vehicle you must register it immediately. When establishing your identity for your Manitoba license and insurance, we can only accept documents printed within the last 90 days, and in accordance with MPI's regulations which are subject to change. All names and addresses must match in order to support the requirements.

Most common requirements when applying for a Manitoba driver's license (see full list for all documents to fulfill requirements):

- Valid Canadian Passport or Birth Certificate
- Driver's License from previous jurisdiction (if applicable)
- 2 documents showing your current Manitoba address (MPI accepts **only** the following:
 - Monthly Utility Bill (only one may be used and a credit card statement cannot be accepted);
 - Vehicle Registration Card;
 - Bank Statement (stamped by a teller) or Cancelled Cheque;
 - Mortgage or Lease Document;
 - Personal income tax document;
 - Employment Confirmation (must show name and address of employer and employee);
 - Social Assistance benefit confirmation;
 - Guarantor Form;
 - Manitoba Health Card.
- Government-issued marriage certificate (or other linking document), if your current legal name does not match other "Entitlement" documents used. Church-issued or other such certificates **cannot be accepted** for new Manitobans. If you have had more than one name change, all changes must be supported by appropriate linking documents.

If you need to change your auto coverage, also bring:

Ownership document:

- If you own the vehicle: current ownership document from previous jurisdiction
- If you have a leased vehicle, bring either:
 - Your original lease agreement from your previous jurisdiction **and** a signed letter on the leasing company's letterhead confirming that they are now collecting Manitoba taxes, showing their MB tax number, OR
 - An amended lease agreement from Manitoba
- Valid Manitoba safety inspection (they are valid for one year)
- Claims history from previous jurisdiction

LEASED VEHICLE

You will need to provide one of the following:

1. Amended Lease Agreement showing Manitoba address and Manitoba Sales tax collected
2. Old lease agreement with a letter of authorization from leasing company to register the vehicle in Manitoba and provide their Manitoba Sales tax number, stating taxes are now being paid to Manitoba
3. Manitoba Safety is required before registering the vehicle
